



STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES: REDUCING THE PRESENCE OF ALCOHOL

CAPPING EVENTS WITH ALCOHOL

To enhance safety within a fraternity community, the IFC should evaluate and cap the number of social events with alcohol that each fraternity can have in a term.

To start, think about the average number of events with alcohol fraternities held in the previous semester. For example, Fraternity A had 8, Fraternity B had 12, Fraternity C had 10, Fraternity D had 12. The average for the campus would be 10 in a semester.

The goal for the next term should be just a little bit less. It's a manageable change that allows the council to consistently reduce the presence of alcohol in the fraternity community over time.

When setting the event cap, be sure to involve stakeholders like chapter Presidents, the IFC Advisor, and chapter advisors. Additionally, when making the decision, be sure to follow the IFC's Constitution and Bylaws appropriately.
