What does the job of the IFC Service and Philanthropy Officer entail? Check out the list below for a quick overview.

As the IFC Service and Philanthropy officer, the **coordination of community service opportunities and philanthropic efforts** rests with you. Community service is a pillar of most, if not all, member chapters, and is a great public relations tool for the fraternity community. All IFC and IFC-hosted community service events also allow members to give back to the campus and the surrounding neighborhood. The discussion of community service opportunities and events should take place at the start of every semester.

DUTIES

- Develop service projects and philanthropic events for IFCs and member fraternities
- Promote interfraternal service by organizing annual community service projects
- Engage the fraternity community in a discussion about the importance of community service opportunities and events
- Collect and report member fraternity community service hours, philanthropic dollars, and activities
- Create and/or update a list of service event ideas for chapters and share it with the community
- Offer philanthropy event ideas to chapters and record successful past events for future officers to consider
- Provide advice and support to member fraternity community service/philanthropy officer
- Ensure the value of service within the entire community is part of the new member education for all IFC groups
