NIC Overview

- North American Interfraternity Conference (NIC)
- Trade association for men's inter/national fraternities
- Represents 61 men's inter/national fraternities with over 6,000 chapters on 600 campuses
- Member fraternities = NIC
- Focused on supporting the fraternity experience
- Advocacy. Education. Standards. Insights.



Role of the IFC



Advocacy: Works on behalf of and for the betterment of all member fraternities



Marketing: Promotes the value of the fraternity experience and creates interest in joining a fraternity



Collaboration: A place to solve problems together and move community forward together



Education: Coordinates educational experiences related to health and safety, community expectations, and topics relevant to the fraternity and student experience



Accountability: Establishes a fair, peer-led process to hold members accountable to a code of conduct that is based on shared values



Role in Recruitment (IFC SOP)

1. IFC adopts an **open bidding policy** that allows member fraternities to extend bids to interested men at any time.
2. IFC maintains a **new member interest list**.
3. The IFC recruitment officer compiles and distributes **resources for chapter recruitment officers**.
4. IFC executes an **annual marketing plan** for its community.
5. IFC actively partners with admissions, orientation and residence hall staff to **introduce students and their families to fraternity membership**.



Telling Our Story: Key Research Findings

1. Fraternity Members ***experience stronger mental health and wellness***
2. Fraternities create ***lifelong connection*** to the campus, community, and their peers.
3. Fraternities are an ***accelerator for success***, in college and beyond



Why Men Join Fraternities

Top 3 most important reasons for joining:

1. Finding a place to **belong** (community)
2. Professional / alumni **networking** opportunities
3. Making **friends**

Top 3 concerns about joining:

1. **Cost** to join
2. **Time** commitment
3. Potential for negative impact on **academics**

What should IFCs be doing in general?

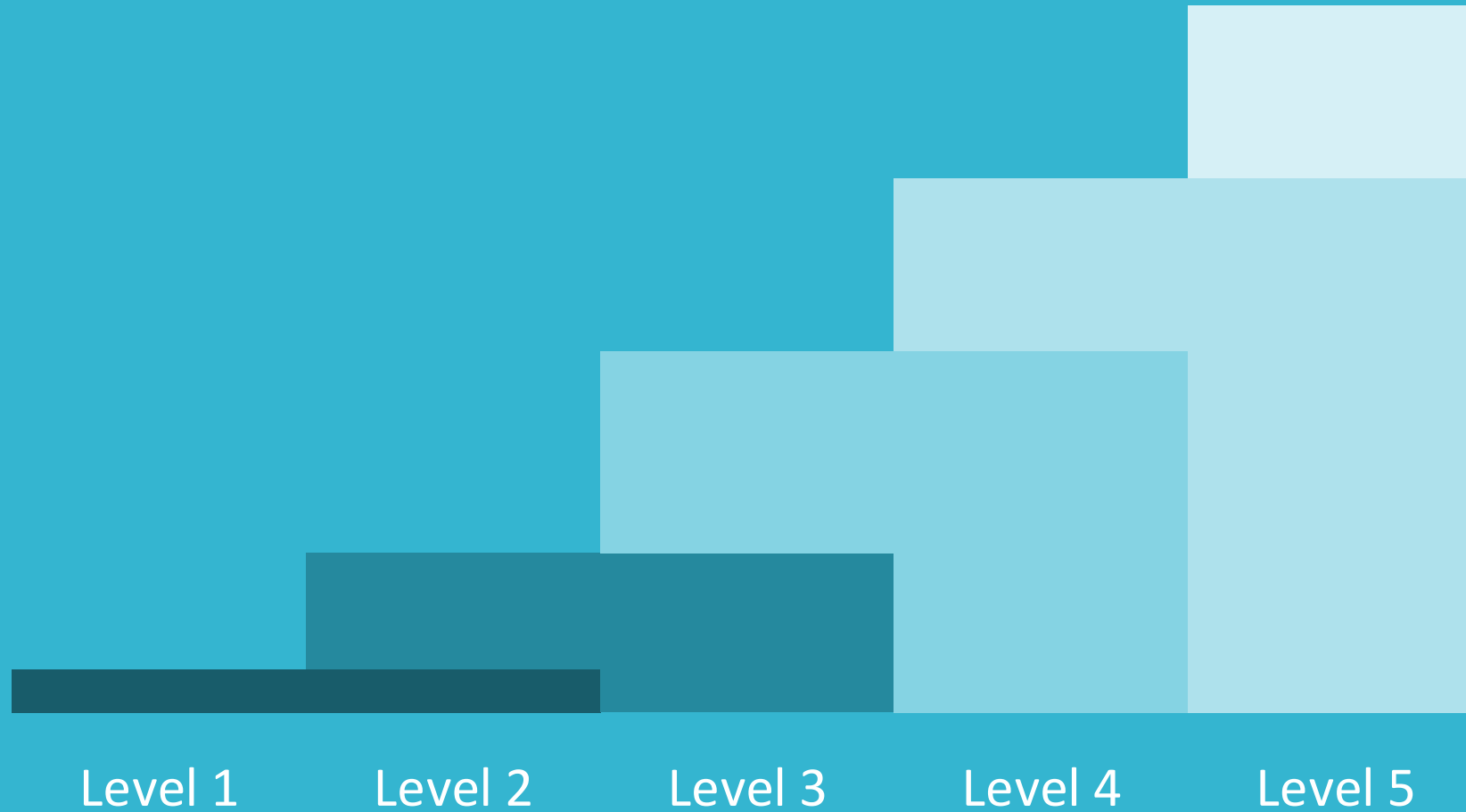
IFC Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)

- SOPs are a framework for IFCs to prioritize actionable operations across 12 areas:
 - Academics, Accountability, Administrative, Communications, Finance, Governance, Health and Safety, Leadership, Membership Access, Programming, Recruitment, Data Reporting
- Baseline of policies and practices for IFCs to operate in accordance with NIC Standards and Positions, endorsed by all NIC member fraternities
- Foundational to aspirational (“do this first before you try to do that next”)

IFC Insurance Program

- Councils should carry sufficient liability insurance coverage
- IFC Insurance Program includes general liability insurance, commercial crime insurance, and protection for directors and officers
 - This does not apply to chapters, but IFC sponsored events
- Most host institutions do not cover the IFC as a student organization
 - However if you're covered by a different entity, you can upload proof of coverage in FS Central and we'll remove that amount from invoice
- No, your chapter's liability insurance does not cover the activities hosted by the IFC you serve



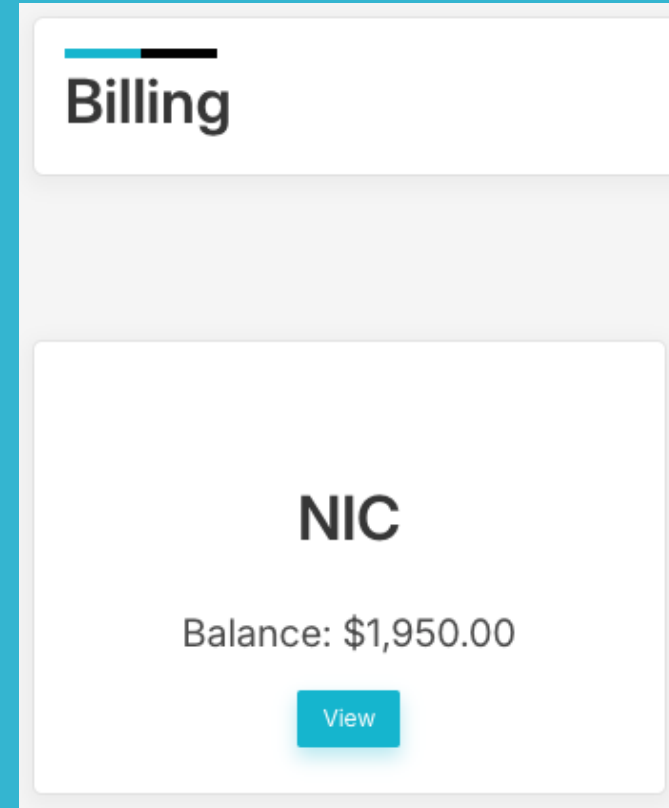
Budget for Campus Support & Insurance

- Check your balance (both your IFC account & in FS Central)
- Finalize your current term budget
- Look to the fall
 - Rollover, dues for members & anticipated new members
 - Your 2026-2027 Dues & Insurance bill (FS Central)
 - Anticipate your future bill to be similar to last year's bill (slight inflation)
 - Set your programming budget, and determine any NIC Campus Support Packages



FS Central Billing: Dues & Insurance

- Check your balance
 - Note: will include dues and insurance bundled, based on Tier
 - *(Friendly reminder: SOP alignment calls for NIC member org chapters to be part of a dues-paying IFC w/adequate insurance coverage)*
 - Side note: Update IFC officers and campus contacts under "**Contacts**"
 - Side-side note: Be sure to update active chapters under "**Chapter Listing**" (used for tiered billing)



Health, Safety & Wellness Resources

- We care about our members and guests
- IFC will have the policies and programming consistent with the NIC Guidelines on Alcohol & Drugs.
- Enhanced health and safety standards
 - Policy prohibiting alcohol above 15% ABV
 - Cap the # of events each fraternity can have with alcohol
 - Guest-to-member ratio of no more than 3:1 for events with alcohol
 - not to exceed X attendees (set campus standard) or fire code (whichever is lower)



Health, Safety & Wellness Resources

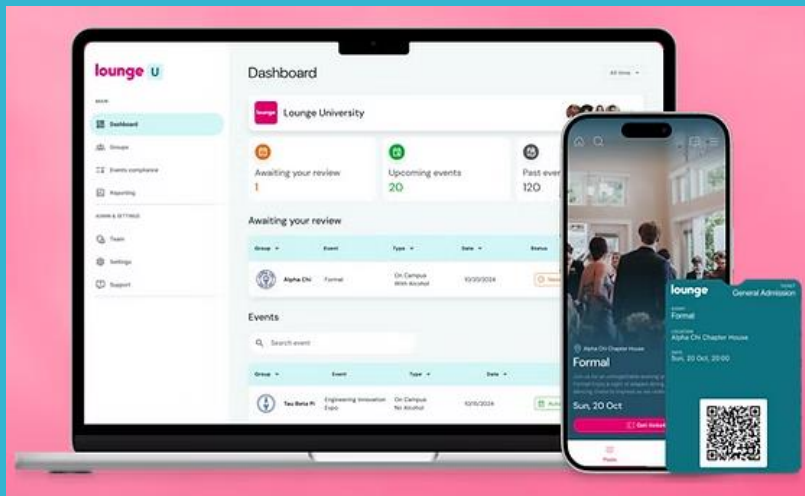
- Reminder: As outlined in the IFC Judicial Code, hazing and sexual assault should be adjudicated through the university conduct processes — not by the IFC.
- Otherwise maintain an IFC Judicial Board and provide health and safety education and training for chapters each term.

MANUAL & Release U: men's mental health and wellbeing

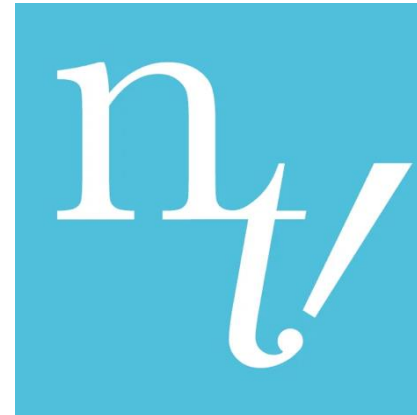
MANUAL & Release U provide a digital personal development platform and coaching addressing the unique needs of male students, who often hesitate to seek help.
